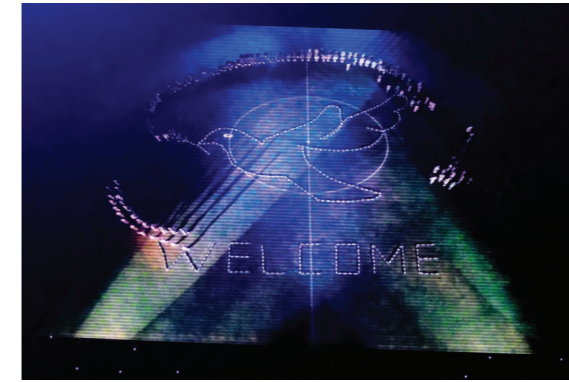

The 2nd CISM World Football Cup

After the 1st edition of the CISM Football Trophy in Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan in 2013, the entire CISM family has been eagerly looking forward to this second edition, which is now called the CISM Football World Cup and organized under the guidance of the CISM and Sultan Qaboos bin Said, the Sultan of Oman and Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces of the Sultanate of Oman.

The 2nd CISM World Football Cup of Football was awarded to Oman in 2014 at the CISM General Assembly

in Quito, Ecuador, and the Sultanate was able to count on the experience it gained when it hosted the Asian Continental Qualification Tournament for the 1st CISM Football Trophy in Azerbaijan in early 2013.

In addition, the least that can be said is that the Oman delegation put on a great show to welcome the 16 teams that qualified for this first major event of the 2017 CISM sporting calendar. As soon as they arrived in Muscat, the capital of the Sultanate of Oman, the athletes and offi-

cial of the 16 participating nations (Oman, Bahrain, Republic of Guinea, France, Algeria, Germany, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Islamic Republic of Iran, Qatar, Mali, Ireland, USA, Syria, Egypt, Poland and Canada) knew that this 2nd CISM World Football Cup would be a great success. As well as the omnipresent sunshine, which was eclipsed for two days by exceptional rainfall for the region, the warm welcome and exceptional sports and accommodation facilities had already helped to create a climate of confidence and



relaxation. Everything was perfect throughout the competition: the transport system, the accommodation, the food on offer, an ubiquitous security service, the training conditions, the press center and the matches being broadcasted on the Sultanate of Oman's main channel, Oman TV.

The conditions were therefore ideal for the 16 teams that competed, from 15 to 28 January 2017, in the country's three main stadiums: the Sultan Qaboos Sports Complex

(30,000 capacity), the Seeb Sports Stadium (13,400 capacity) and the Police Sports Stadium (12,000 capacity).

The Sultan Qaboos Sports Complex Stadium, which was built in 1985 and conforms to FIFA standards, was the venue for the Opening Ceremony of the 2nd CISM World Football Cup on the evening of 15 January 2017. It was in the presence of His Highness Sayyid Shihab Bin Tariq Al-Said, the Advisor to His Majesty the Sultan, Colonel Abdulhakeem Alshino (BRN),

the CISM President, Colonel Dorah Mamby Koita (GUI), the CISM Secretary General, Lieutenant General PSC Ahmed bin Harith bin Nasser Al Nabhani, the Chief of Staff of the Sultan's Armed Forces, the CISM Family and many football fans, that the 2nd CISM Football World Cup officially kicked off on a superb evening.

The ceremony was simple, solemn, and military and embellished with local dances (Razha / Mudema and Tanbura / Al-Barah), as well as a drum show.





These two weeks of competition were also aimed at celebrating world peace through joy, sport and friendship under the CISM slogan «Friendship through Sport» and the participation of 16 nations this event is already a success in itself. Also in this context, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea's participation in the tournament was also a great source of satisfaction for the CISM.

What's more, the sporting spectacle put on by the athletes was of high quality and enhanced by numerous

individual and team performances worthy of the level of professional footballers. Indeed, the Asian continent rose to the challenge of the event, by having four nations in the quarter-finals and three nations in the semi-finals. After an initial group stage, in which the 16 nations were divided into four groups of four, Oman (the host country), Qatar, Egypt, Algeria and Syria were being talked about as the favorites to win the tournament. All of the European teams except Germany, the teams from the Americas, as well as Guinea,

the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Islamic Republic of Iran were eliminated in the first round. In the quarter-finals, Oman lived up to its status as favorite by eliminating Mali, Egypt beat a very attractive and entertaining Algerian team, Syria won against a spirited German side and Qatar had to dig deep to beat Bahrain on penalties. The semi-finals looked explosive, with two matches pitting Oman against Egypt and Qatar against Syria. After a game full of suspense, the home country, backed by a large crowd, took advantage of the



great form of its goalkeeper Al Rashidi to qualify for the grand final in a penalty shoot-out that will go down in history. In the other semi-final, Qatar repeated its quarterfinal performance and needed a penalty shoot-out to eventually win against Syria.

Unfortunately for the Qataris, the old saying «things always come in threes» was not true in the final, which was played in a packed stadium before a partisan crowd supporting the host country. It was still 0-0 after 120 minutes and the two

teams had to decide the winner in another tense penalty shoot-out. Once again, Al Rashidi, who was logically voted as the best goalkeeper in the tournament, made sure that everyone agreed on this, as two Qatari players missed their penalties by shooting wide and against the post. Al Khaldi, Oman's number 10, saved his teammates and scored the winning penalty to give his country a deserved victory!

Oman is the new Military Football World Champion!

The Mali team was rewarded for its exemplary behavior throughout the tournament with a trophy, which is just as important as Champion's Trophy, the Fair Play Trophy!

Besides the sporting aspect, we also need to acknowledge the excellent technical organization and emphasize the efficient collaboration that it required. We must also point out the splendid long-term work carried out by the Armed Forces of the Sultanate of Oman in collaboration with the City of Muscat, the CISM





General Secretariat (and especially Colonel Dorah Mamby Koita, the CISM Secretary General and Colonel Abdulaheem Bello, the Project Manager of the 2nd CISM World Football Cup), not to mention the members of the CISM Football Committee, represented by its President, Captain Rudolf Fell. This has once again proved the extent to which collaboration between everyone is necessary and crucial for such an undertaking to succeed.

CISM also took the opportunity of this major event to sign a partnership agreement with the Jungwon University in order to establish a new

academic program in the university itself, “the CISM Masters Study Program”. Indeed, Jungwon University, represented by his Honorable Dr. Park Chankyu, Dean of Jungwon University and Mr. Kim Jin, Dean of the International Admission Department of Jungwon University, decided to accompany CISM in educating the future generations of sports managers so that CISM can benefit from a more solid academic background in order to keep improving its management and its activities.

When the Closing Ceremony put an end to the 2nd CISM WFC, all the participants already had their heads

full of memories and their thoughts already turned towards 2021, for the third edition in a host country which has not yet been announced. There is no doubt, however, that the Sultanate of Oman, with the quality of its organization, the warmth of its welcome and the sporting level of the tournament, as well as the resulting media attention, will have encouraged many countries to apply to host the 3rd edition of the CISM World Football Cup!

Muscat 2017 was great and 2021 can't come soon enough!
