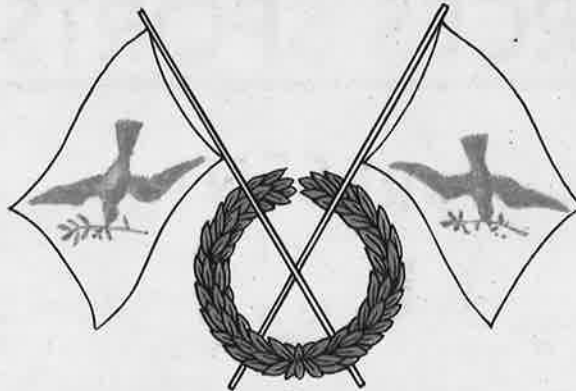

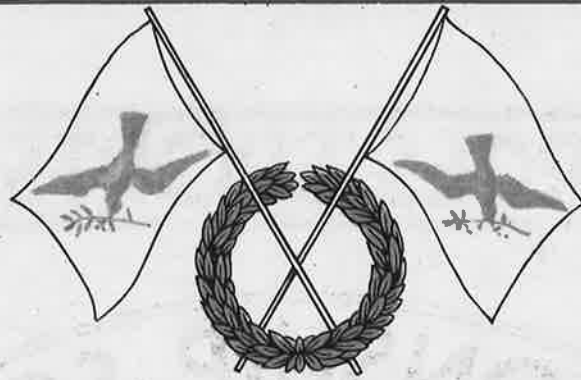

HISTORY OF ALLIED FORCES SPORTS COUNCIL

The Allied Forces Sports Council was created on 7 February 1946. The Council was composed of two representatives from each of the following Armies: Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Great Britain, Holland, Luxembourg, Norway, Poland, Russia, United States.

The Council is designed to promote goodwill and further understanding between members of the Allied Forces. It has concerned itself primarily with stimulating and coordinating athletic competition among Allied troops. The Council has had three meetings. The initial meeting was devoted to building the organizational and administrative structure of the Council. During this first meeting the following officers were elected:

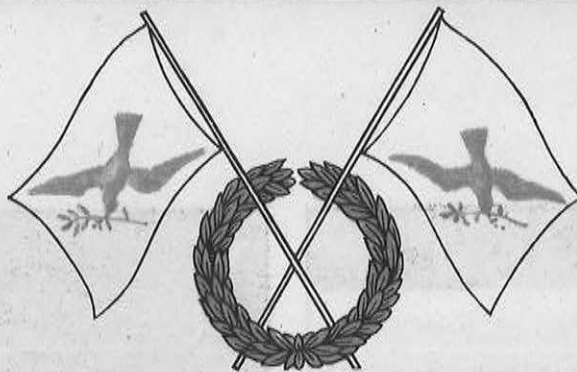
Chairman: Col. Charles E. Hoy, U.S. Army. Vice-Chairman: Major Roger de Loche, French Army.
Executive Secretary: Major Joseph E. Dunn, U.S. Army.

The second meeting of the Council was devoted to the drawing up of a schedule of tournaments, each of which will be sponsored by one of the member Armies. The Allied Forces Sports Council Swimming Championship was the first of such tournaments and was held in Nurnberg, Germany on 16, 17, 18 August 1946.

At the third meeting of the Council Col. Russell T. Finn replaced Col. Hoy as U.S. delegate and as chairman of the Council. At this meeting Greece was accepted as the twelfth nation in the AFSC.

The Olympic Stadium, located in the British area, was prepared for the Allied Track and Field Meet by Headquarters BTB, Maj General E. P. Mares, CBE, MC, Commanding.

Accommodations, transportation, recreation, and preparations for the Allied Track and Field Meet were arranged by OMGUS, Lt. Gen. Lucius D. Clay, Commanding, and Berlin District, Maj. General Frank A. Keating, Commanding.
