Air Base 133 – Nancy-Ochey

Today, Air Base 133 gathers around 1600 Air Force personnel covering over 40 different professions. The last air base of Alsace-Lorraine, it is home to almost a quarter of French combat aviation assets and Fighters with its 50 Mirage 2000D.

Due to the 3rd Fighter Wing (*3^e Escadre de Chasse*), BA 133 of Nancy-Ochey plays an essential role in the French Air Force's immediate intervention missions. It also contributes to the entirety of operational defence taskings: Territorial Defence, Reconnaissance, Intelligence and Dissuasion.



A true expeditionary corps of the French Air Force, the 3rd Wing counts around 800 personnel of which about 150 are flight personnel and 600 engineering personnel. Composed of three fighter squadrons (EC 1/3 'Navarre', EC 2/3 'Champagne', EC 3/3 'Ardennes'), The Mirage Transformation Squadron Mirage 2000D (ETD 4/3 'Argonne') and an Aerospace Technical Support Squadron (ESTA 15/3 'Malzéville').

Its training and combat capabilities are guaranteed by the Activity Support Group (*Groupement d'appui à l'activité*) composed of technical and logistics units specialised in the maintenance of avionics and air traffic control.

An international commitment

Air Base 133 is also host to the Air Support Training Centre (*Centre de Formation à l'Appui Aérien - CFAA*), a Franco-German NATO school that trains Forward Air Controllers for the French and German Armed Forces.

Today and for over a hundred years, the crews, technical staff and the personnel of the Nancy-Ochey air base prepare and fight for peace and the security of France, often far from our own soils. Since 1999, the Mirage 2000D of Air Base 133 have participated in all French overseas operations. After a long period of time spent in the Levant as part of Operation Chammal, the Mirages of Nancy-Ochey are now deployed in the Sahel as part of Operation Barkhane and continue to ensure the training and education of young crews on French soil.

It is a great pleasure and honour for the city of Nancy and the metropolitan territory to host the 46th World Military Fencing Championships.

Nancy has a long tradition of hosting sporting events, this competition and the Tour de France, the next 9th July are another chapter in the sporting chronicles of the City of the Dukes of Lorraine.

The cooperation of the City of Nancy before all other things, bears witness to the recognition of the attachment of this city and its citizens to Air Base 133 (*Base Aérienne 133 de Nancy-Ochey*) which is organising this international event. The birth of the French Fencing School officially goes back to the 16th Century when King Charles IXth authorised the 'Master Players and Epée Fencers' (*Maîtres Joueurs et Escrimeurs d'Épée*) of the city of Paris to congregate and create a community. However, it is mainly during the 19th Century that the French Fencing School forged its global reputation and aura

through multiple treaties drafted by Masters of great talent who travelled the world to export and improve their art.

With 115 Olympic Medals, France imposes itself as a master in this discipline that has been animated by a renewed interest over the past few years. The French Fencing Federation now accounts for 64,000 licenced Members and 120,000 practitioners.

Traditional French Sport, the French Language is the official language of the sport, mandatory for refereeing during international competitions.

Respect, self-control and bravery are the fundamental values of the fencer who must combine physical performance and moral quality. It is therefore entirely natural that French Soldiers and their foreign counterparts have illustrated themselves in this discipline and take part in these 46th World Military Fencing Championships.

A few rules to be aware of:

- **Foil:** Conventional thrusting weapon.

Hits are only counted to the torso and, must be as much as possible, hit alternatively by the Fencers. In the case of a simultaneous hit, the point is given to the attacker and then as per parry-riposte mechanics.

- **Sabre:** Conventional cut and thrusting weapon. Allows for hits with the tip and edge of the blade in the same way as the Foil with attack parry and riposte priority, however, hits to the torso, head and arms are counted.

- **Épée:** Combat thrusting weapon.

Hits are registered on the whole body. The point is given to the first Fencer to register a hit. In the case of a simultaneous hit during an exchange, a point is given to each.

The International Military Sports Council CISM



CISM is a French initiative, an adventure embarked upon by a French Major (OF-3) the Chef de Bataillon DEBRUS, who had the idea in the aftermath of World War II to have armies face each other on the sports fields, and not on the battlefield.

Five countries, France, Luxemburg, Belgium, the Netherlands and Denmark decided to accomplish this in setting the foundations of this council on the 18th February 1948 in the city of Nice with the motto of “Friendship through Sport.” Today, 138 countries participate each year in several continental or global competitions including the World Military Summer and Winter Games, held a year before their respective Olympic Games. In essence, CISM is the military International Olympic Committee (IOC).

The 21st April 2018, in Punta Cana (Dominican Republic) a new CISM President was elected by the CISM General Assembly. With the support of Mr. Emmanuel Macron, President of the French Republic and under the auspices of Mrs Florence Parly, the Minister of the Armed Forces, the Chief Head of Defence wanted to present the candidacy of the Commissioner for Military Sports to the position of CISM President. Subsequently, the Commissioner for Military Sport and Commanding Officer of the National Defence Sports Centre (CNSD) was elected for a four-year mandate. This presidency will champion the development of international cooperation, the organisation of sporting events for our wounded soldiers and reinforce the image of the Armed Forces and France abroad.



The National Defence Sports Centre (CNSD)

A hub for Military and Sporting Excellence



Heir to a long and glorious military and sporting history, the National Defence Sports Centre (*Centre national des sports de la Défense - CNSD*) is a joint forces organism placed under the authority of the Chief Head of Defence. The Commanding Officer of the CNSD also assumes the role of Commissioner for Military Sport. The CNSD executes the sporting policy of the Ministry of the Armed Forces. Guarantor of operational preparedness of our Armed Forces, the CNSD is tasked by the Ministry with the conception, animation, evaluation and study of military, sporting and physical activity within the armed forces as well as the elaboration of the regulations that govern military sport and the organisation, coordination and activity of the Military Physical and Sports Training (EPMS) and Equestrian branches.



The CNSD contributes to the reinsertion via sport of our wounded soldiers. To this end it trains specialised personnel and takes part in the 'Military Meetings: Wounded and Sport'. It also organises training courses and exercises for our wounded soldiers taking part in national and international competitions.



In association with other ministries, the CNSD develops sport for all and encourages the strengthening of the bond between the armed forces and the nation. Furthermore, it manages the High-Level Defence Athletes (*Sportifs de haut niveau de la Défense - SHND*) placed under the responsibility of the Commissioner for Military Sport within a team designated as the Army of Champions "Armée de Champions."

In liaison with the three services of the armed forces and the Gendarmerie nationale, the CNSD also organises the national and international military sporting events in individual or team sports. It participates in the international sporting instances such as the International Military Sports Council, CISM and contributes to the profile and image of France by promoting the sports policy of the Ministry of the Armed Forces.
